

## Insurance Coverage of new shooters

NRAA's insurance provides cover for members and those on a pathway to become members – ie in their probationary period.

It does not provide coverage to general public who wish to shoot – they need to become a member.

# **Membership Policy**

Revised 1st March 2023

#### Membership

#### General

Every person who engages in or officiates at any NRAA activity, except for persons of paid employ and who are covered by way of their employer for Workers Compensation, or like policy, will hold "primary membership" as defined in this policy.

- Every person who is a member of an Australian Rifle Club and who engages in or officiates at any level of Fullbore and other disciplines competition as governed by Standard Shooting Rules (SSR) and promoted by any of NRAA's entities must be a financial member of both NRAA and their State Association.
- 2. The membership status of persons who fall outside, or are not clearly defined by this Policy, shall be determined by the Board of NRAA (in its absolute discretion).
- 3. Any potential new member may participate for a probationary period of six (6) months and up to 15 shooting activities as an Authorised Visitor. During this period, these persons are not eligible to enter open competitions. Once these limits have been reached, they will be required to become a member of NRAA and their State Association provided that the Club has approved their membership application.

Rationale: This ensures that people who engage in target shooting as defined in the SSRs or who officiate in an NRAA activity are appropriately covered by NRAA's insurance policy.

### Murwillumbah RC – Constitution regarding membership:

- (a) Membership is open to all persons who accept and agree to abide by the objects and rules of the Murwillumbah Rifle Club Inc (the club).
- (b) A person wishing to become a member of the Murwillumbah Rifle Club must be nominated by two members of good standing and apply to the Committee on the: 3b form provided to applicant
- (d) Members must participate in a minimum of four shoots each year.
- (e) <u>Before being eligible to apply</u>, all intending members are subject to a trial period <u>within 3 months</u> where they are to familiarise themselves and be made known to other members by <u>Attending 4</u> <u>shoots as a visitor within the start of this trial period</u>, Section 3.b. Form must be completed with the application for membership.
- (f) All prospective members must be licensed, have applied for or in the process of applying for a licence by the end of the trial period.
